The College of Engineering at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) is excited to announce several opportunities for high school students during the summer!

- Girls' Adventures in Mathematics, Engineering, and Science (GAMES) Camp is an annual week-long camp designed to give academically talented high school *girls* (rising 9th-12th graders) an opportunity to focus on one of the following engineering disciplines: aerospace, bioengineering, chemical, materials, electrical, mechanical, and computer science. - mid-GLAM (Middle School Girls Learning about Materials) Camp is an annual week-long, **FREE**, day camp for middle school girls (rising 6th-8th graders) where students will have the opportunity to think like a "material's scientist". They will investigate how materials are put together, how they can be used, and how they can be changed and improved. Campers will have hands-on exposure to the materials that run our society, how to make them, understand their function, and how we can predict the ways they will evolve in the future.
- The Worldwide Youth in Science & Engineering (WYSE) program offers a week-long residential camp for students interested in learning about different engineering disciplines offered at UIUC. The Exploring Your Options Camp invites all rising 11th-12th graders, while Discover Engineering invites all rising 9th-10th graders. The WYSE program also offers three specialized tracks: Exploring Mechanical Science & Engineering for rising 11th-12th graders, Discover Bioengineering for rising 9th-10th graders, and Exploring Nuclear, Plasma, and Radiological Engineering (NPRE) for rising 11th-12th graders. - Illinois Aerospace Institute (IAI) is a one-week residential program for students interested in learning about aerospace engineering and aviation. Enrollment in the programs are limited to ensure the quality of the academic experience. All camps have a selective admissions process based on academic performance, a written essay and a teacher recommendation. Note that the mid-GLAM Camp ONLY requires an essay (no teacher recommendation letter or grades information). Placement in a camp is contingent on when the application is completed, so please have students apply soon to ensure placement in their desired camp. **The application deadline is April 15, 2018, or until camps are full.** With the help of generous corporate sponsors, we also offer scholarships to students who need financial assistance for the tuition payment.
