2-Data Analysis and Identified Trends:

During the past year Pontiac Township High School has not appeared in the top 20% for suspension rate, however the district did during the previous few years. Having said this, as seen below, there is a discrepancy in the enrollment numbers reported by ISBE and the actual data. Once the enrollment numbers were corrected, Pontiac Township High School was no longer part of the top 20%.

3-Potential Action Plan to Reduce the Use of Exclusionary Discipline and/or Racial Disproportionality:

Pontiac Township High School has been committed to enhancing the classroom management strategies used by both veteran and new teachers. This classroom management model is part of our new teacher induction program as well as being a professional development opportunity offered to our veteran faculty. The training includes components of being trauma informed, behavior de-escalation techniques, and understanding how socio-economic status influences students. The overall goal of this model is to create positive relationships, define clear expectations for student behavior, manage behaviors in positive way, and measure the effectiveness of the strategies. As seen by the above data, student behavior has improved to the point where we are no longer in the top 20% for our suspension rate.
